## Southern Fulton School District ARP-ESSER Funding – 7% Set-Aside Programs

Southern Fulton School District's 3-year proposed plan for the use of the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief – 7% Set Aside Programs Grant breaks down into the following 3 areas:

## - Comprehensive Learning Loss - \$79,927

- 30% Requirement to Address the Social, Emotional, and Mental Health Needs of Students: Pay a portion of salary to maintain the Elementary Guidance Counselor position for the 2022-2023 school year that was created and funded through ESSER I and ESSER II.
- O 10% Requirement to Provide Professional Development to Staff to Address the Social, Emotional, and Mental Health Needs of Students: Pay for additional training and conferences for school counselors and other identified staff members related to Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS), Trauma-Informed, Creating Trauma-Sensitive Schools (CTSS), Student Assistance Program (SAP), and Crisis Prevention during the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school years.
- 8% Requirement to Address Reading Remediation and Improvement for Students:
   Pay for external and internal educators to provide compensatory education to those students identified as requiring intensive supports, transportation for students to attend after-school, weekend, and summer remediation services, and purchase of the Sonday System, which allows for students of all backgrounds and skill levels to receive intervention, enrichment, and tutoring during the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school years, as well as the summer of 2022 and 2023.
- o 52% of the Funds Used to Address Additional Learning Loss Needs: Pay for the remaining salary to maintain the Elementary Guidance Counselor position for the 2022-2023 school year that was created and funded through ESSER I and ESSER II, pay internal and external staff to provide additional opportunities for SAT remediation, SAT prep, and AP Exam during the 2022-2023 school year, pay for external providers for additional counseling and social work for students in need during the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 school year, and purchase a system for the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school year that tracks and analyzes data for students that have been identified with additional social and emotional learning needs.

## - After-School Set Aside - \$15,985

 Regular and Special Education Programs: Pay for highly qualified teachers to provide after-school tutoring to students that have been identified with remediation needs during the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school years.

## - Summer School Set-Aside - \$15,985

- High School Credit Recovery and Tutoring: Pay for teachers and additional external online courses to provide students with opportunities to recover previously failed credit courses and remediation during the summer of 2022 and 2023.
- Elementary Tutoring and Summer Camps: Pay for teachers and external providers to tutor students in the summer and provide opportunities that will improve their social skills and learning levels through hands-on camp opportunities during the summer of 2022 and 2023.
- ELL Tutoring: Pay for a highly qualified teacher to provide summer tutoring in 2022 and 2023 to those identified English Language Learners who faced particular difficulties with virtual learning.
